

HAWAII AoH TRAINING

THE ART OF FACILITATION: LEADING SOCIAL INNOVATION FOR CHANGE

OVERVIEW

The Art of Facilitation brings the globally recognized practice of the Art of Hosting (AoH), for the first time to our islands. This training will teach new skills and provide frameworks for Hawaii's leaders and facilitators to build strong core teams, work with community and stakeholders, identify and leverage common ground and lead systemic change. You will learn to host meaningful conversations, harvest the intelligence of our diverse communities, find shared purpose, and implement strategies for change. AoH cultivates facilitative leadership and collaboration using frameworks that invite curiosity, non-judgment, generosity, and wise action. This training will teach new skills for innovation across all forms of multi-stakeholder systems.

The types of questions we will explore include:

- How do we build strong core teams and activate a community of learning in our organizations?
- What methodologies, frameworks and ways of working together can help us tap into our shared purpose so that together, we can create wiser impact and systemic change?
- How can we co-create a thriving environmentally and socially just future for Hawaii?

THE TRAINING

You will experience and learn practical facilitation tools through action-learning including:

- Process-design
- Collaborative problem solving
- Non-judgmental learning

You will gain understanding of specific powerful frameworks that guide process design, including:

- World Café
- ProAction Café
- Circle Processes
- Theory U
- Open Space Technology

These tools can be used in diverse settings ranging from small to large groups, and across generations and cultures.

THE TRAINERS



Dana Pearlman is co-author of [The Lotus: Authentic Leadership Development for a Just, Resilient and Thriving World](#). She designs and facilitates action learning experiences that incorporate whole person development, mission driven entrepreneurship with systems thinking, and being and doing for social innovation. Her academic background is in clinical psychology and strategic leadership towards sustainability.

She uses participatory facilitation processes and powerful questions to enable deeper wisdom at the

individual, team, organizational and community levels. Her intent is to steward a world that is more whole, interconnected and in alignment with our true selves for wiser and conscious impact. Her sweet spot is at the intersection of authentic leadership, tapping into other ways of knowing (beyond cognition), collective healing and cultivating communities of practice in order to accelerate the profound transformation that is needed in our world.

Dana is also co-creating a start up, the [Global Leadership Lab](#), to bring people together to catalyze and accelerate the world-changing leadership necessary to meet the profound challenges of the 21st century.



Roe Cummings is the Community Host at Impact Hub Oakland and is the creator of the This is Vallejo Project (www.thisisvallejo.com). By way of Field Assessments in East Africa (Food For the Hungry, Intl.), Ethnographical Research Facilitation for university students in Southeast Asia (GoEd Mekong Delta), and managing one of the largest co-working spaces in the North America (Impact Hub San Francisco), Roshanda was lead to the Art of Hosting and weaves it into her facilitation work and inclusive place-making and economic development efforts in her native Bay Area.

A trained practitioner and aspiring Steward of The Art of Hosting, Roshanda has both participated in and co-facilitated hosting teams internationally. She has seen Art of Hosting's "user"-centered design, facilitation methods, adaptive approach, and powerful questions change people's lives-and as a result, has herself been changed. Other accomplishments includes being a resident moderator for SOCAP '11, 12, and Soul, alder for Dalai Lama Fellows, board member for GoEd Study Abroad Programs, and facilitator for both ReAllocate's Hacktivation for the Homeless and the Impact HUB Global's Strategy Gathering.

She is passionate about facilitating opportunities in Hawaii for people to find purpose and thriving careers that serve community and the environment. She has designed sustainability curriculum and engagement programs for the University of Hawaii and the Department of Education, is the Hawaii Educational Consultant for the UHCC-Johnson Controls Partnership, and co-founded the Rewarding Internships for Sustainable

Employment (RISE) program. Shanah is currently leading the founding team of Impact HUB Honolulu to create a thriving co-working center in Kaka'ako for social entrepreneurs to connect with training, funders and a supportive network.

Shanah is also passionate about collaborating for change. With degrees in mechanical engineering and urban planning and as a LEED accredited professional, she founded [Smart Sustainability Consulting](#), which has trained 75% of the Hawaii National Guard and dozens of private and public schools to energy audit their buildings, identifying millions in no-cost savings and creating institutional culture shifts toward energy conscious behavior.



Jonathan Swanz is an [artist](#) specializing in curriculum development, space curation and community building for social action. He is an adjunct professor in the UH Manoa Department of Art and Art History and is a member of the Impact HUB Honolulu founding team. Jonathan founded a campus organization focused on engagement in social issues, participated in programs such as Meals on Wheels and Big Brothers and Sisters, curated fundraisers for the Kentucky Refugee Ministries, created and led workshops for the Council for Developmental Disabilities and has contributed artwork to dozens of charity organizations and events.

He studies and practices the Hawaiian Healing Arts of Lomi Lomi and has practiced and taught yoga for 15 years.
